Home Sweet Home

The Quinnipiac University women's soccer team returns home Sunday afternoon to host Bryant University in their Northeast Conference home-opener. The Bobcats have not played at home since Sept. 13. The game is set to start at 3 p.m. and is the second of a soccer doubleheader, as the Quinnipiac men's team hosts St. Francis (PA) at 12 p.m. at the Quinnipiac Soccer Field. In their last outing, the Bobcats fell to Central Connecticut, 3-2, on Sept. 27.

Scouting the Bulldogs

Bryant has compiled a 2-6 overall record so far this season with a 0-1 record in the NEC. The Bulldogs were most recently shut out, 2-0, by CCSU on Oct. 2. Freshman forward Morgan Derick leads the team with five points (two goals, one assist). Senior goalkeeper Katie Mitchell has started seven games in net for the Bulldogs, recording a .712 save percentage.

Last Time Against the Bulldogs

The Bobcats and the Bulldogs have met just once before during the 2008 season on Oct. 29. After 89 minutes of scoreless play, Bryant's Brooke Duchaney headed the ball over Quinnipiac goalkeeper Jillian Kelley (Simsbury, Conn.) for the 1-0 victory. Kelley picked up four saves in the match, while Amber Sidoti (Farmington, Conn.) led all players in shots with three.

Very Fine

Rookie forward Kemesha Woodfine (Stamford, Conn.) scored her first collegiate goal in the match-up against Central Connecticut. In the 86th minute of play, the freshman positioned herself in front of the net during a Bobcat corner kick and tipped the ball past the Blue Devil's keeper after it landed amongst chaos in the scorer's box.

Five for Furtuna

Sophomore Furtuna Velaj (Stamford, Conn.) recorded her fifth goal of the year in the game against Central, opening up the scoring for the Bobcats. After a CCSU foul inside the scorer's box in the 33rd minute of play, Velaj set up for a penalty kick that she ripped into the left side for her fifth goal of the year. The forward continues to lead the Northeast Conference in goals (5), goals per game (0.71) and points per game (1.86). She ranks second in the conference in points with 13.

A Dish from Donovan

Senior Susan Donovan (Cork, Ireland) picked up her first point of the 2009 season against the Blue Devils. The forward set up the corner kick and booted a perfect arc into the scorer's box that was picked up by Woodfine for the score. The assist was the 13th of her career, boosting her into sixth place all-time in the program's history.

Sister Act

Sophomore forward Kristina Del Mistro (East Williston, N.Y.) will see a familiar face out on the field on Sunday. Her older sister, Steph Del Mistro, is a junior defender for the Bulldogs. The two played against each other once before in last year's game on Oct. 29, where Steph picked up an assist on the lone goal of the match.

Their Goal is Goals

Quinnipiac currently ranks third out of 11 teams in the NEC in goals-per-game with 1.43. The Bobcats have scored ten goals in seven games, playing two less games than the teams ranked ahead of them and are just four goals away from matching the top ranked Central Connecticut (14 goals, 1.56 goals/game).

Forces In Overtime

Quinnipiac has gone into overtime in three of the five games so far this season, with a record of 1-1-1. The Bobcats hold a 5-3 edge in shots over their opponents in overtime.

Climbing the Charts

Goalkeeper Kendra Margulies (Weston, Mass.) continues to rack up the saves in net for the Bobcats. The junior brought down four saves in the game against CCSU, taking her season save total to 41. Margulies ranks third in the NEC in saves-per-game with 5.86.

Dave Clarke enters his eleventh season as the head coach of the Quinnipiac women's soccer team in 2009.

In the 2008 season, Clarke coached the Bobcats to a 7-7-2 overall record and just narrowly missed the post-season by four points. Clarke brought in freshman stand-out Furtuna Velaj (Stamford, Conn.) who led the Northeast Conference in points (31), goals (15) and game-winning goals (7). Velaj was also named to the NEC All-Conference Team at season end.

The Bobcats finished both the 2006 and 2007 seasons with 9-7-2 records and Clarke saw five of his players make it on the NEC All-Conference Team.

Though the Bobcats suffered through an injury-plagued 2005 season while registering a 6-10-3 record, Clarke's squad still performed academically, earning the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Team Academic Award for exemplary performance in the classroom. The team posted a 3.04 grade point average.

Without question, Clarke has already left an indelible mark on the Quinnipiac soccer legacy during his tenure in Hamden.

Back in 2000, Clarke led Quinnipiac to the Northeast Conference tournament title and a berth in the NCAA tournament. The women's soccer team was the first of any kind in school history to qualify for the NCAA tournament at the Division I level.

Once Quinnipiac reached the NCAA's, it knocked off Loyola (Md.) by a score of 2-1 in a Play-in game. From there, QU lost to Harvard by that same tally in a first round contest.

Under Clarke's guidance, Quinnipiac finished the 2000 season with a 13-7-1 mark.

During that off-season, Clarke was also selected to the USSF National Instructional Staff, the highest level of coaching and educating in the United States.

In his first season (1999), Clarke led Quinnipiac to

a 16-5 record and a berth in the Northeast Conference championship game.

In 2001, QU went 12-6 and won the Northeast Conference regular season title. Unfortunately, its hopes for a second straight NCAA tournament bid fell short when Quinnipiac lost in the league tournament semifinals.

In 2002, the Bobcats were decimated by injuries, losing several top players for large portions of the season. Nevertheless, the Bobcats were in the hunt for a Northeast Conference playoff spot up until the final weekend of the year. The Bobcats finished the season with a 3-12-1 mark, but were 3-4-1 in Northeast Conference play.

In 2003, the Bobcats just missed out on a NEC tournament bid and closed with a 4-3-2 mark in league action.

In 2004, the Bobcats finished 8-9-2 with a 5-2-2 mark in the Northeast Conference. Quinnipiac earned the fourth and final spot in the NEC Tournament. The Bobcats were defeated in the semi finals by eventual NEC Champion, Central Connecticut State University. Quinnipiac edged CCSU 1-0 during the regular season. In addition, the Bobcats had the NEC Player and Rookie of the Year in Kirsten van de Ven.

In seven seasons at Quinnipiac, Clarke has posted a 81-72-13 record.

Clarke previously served as the head women's soccer coach of the highly-successful University of New Haven program from 1997-99. At UNH, Clarke posted an overall record of 18-14-3 in his two seasons, including an impressive 12-5-1 mark in 1998. As a result, Clarke was named the New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) Women's Soccer Coach of the Year.

During the off-season, Clarke remains active in the world of soccer. During the summer of 2009, he served as a media intern for the Boston Breakers and Revolution, and the U.S. National Men's and Women's soccer teams. In that position, Clarke not only developed his journalistic skills for his Master's

Degree at Quinnipiac, but also further advanced his own name in professional soccer. Clarke helped scout for both the Breakers and the Women's National Team during his internship.

Clarke has been extremely active in both men's and women's soccer in the state of Connecticut. He is a staff coach for the Connecticut Junior Soccer Association and is a License Instructor for the United States Soccer Federation. Clarke was also a staff coach with both Connecticut and Region I Olympic Development Programs. He holds a USSF 'A' License, a National Youth License, the NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and coaching qualifications from Ireland, England and Holland.

Clarke also served as an assistant coach for the Connecticut Wolves A-League Team from 1996-98. Following a successful collegiate playing career at Central Connecticut, Clarke also played six seasons as a professional for the Wolves from 1993 to 1998.

Clarke was also the head boys' soccer coach at Newington High School from 1994-96, winning two consecutive Central Connecticut Conference titles.

A 1992 graduate of Central Connecticut State University, the Ireland native earned a B.S. in physical education. He served as an assistant coach for the Blue Devils from 1991-93. As an undergraduate, Clarke was a three-year recipient of the CCSU Scholar-Athlete Award (1989, 1990, and 1991). He is currently pursuing a master's degree in Journalism at Quinnipiac.

Currently, Clarke also is the coach of the Connecticut United Wolves U16 and U18 girls' teams. The U18 team are the current Connecticut State Cup Champions and one of the top youth teams in the region. Overall, Clarke's teams have won 10 state championships, a USYSA Region I Championship and a USYSA National Championship.

Clarke and his wife Kelly live in Glastonbury with their daughters, Maire, Aine and twins Bridget and Kevin.
